Camping Equipment

- Sleeping bag
- Pillow
- Mess kit (cup, bowl, plate, fork, knife, spoon, mesh bag)

Clothing

- Hat, gloves, winter jacket, snowpants
- Long underwear, extra socks & gloves
- Sleepwear (PJ's)
- Standard winter clothing
- Change of clothes (2)

Toiletries

- Toothpaste & toothbrush
- Comb
- Deodorant if necessary
- Wash cloth
- Towel
- Soap in container

Miscellaneous

- Lawn chairs (for around campfire)
- Camera
- Flashlight/Lantern
- Handwarmers
- Binoculars
- Ice fishing equipment
- Sleds and tubes (note – sleds will most likely be required to haul gear from car to lodge)
- Board game(s) and/or group games (NO ELECTRONIC GAMES)
- Compass / GPS
- Walking Sticks
- Skit ideas

Notes:

1. First aid kit will be provided by pack

2. All food & drinks (kool-aid only) will be provided by pack – but feel free to bring any extras if you would like. Recommend each family bring bottled water for hikes, etc.
3. Meal and cleanup duties for the weekend will be assigned Friday night upon arrival
